



**Mission:** The mission of Dreaming Out Loud is to create economic opportunities for the DC metropolitan region's marginalized communities through building a healthy equitable food system.

Vision: DOL is rebuilding urban, community-based food systems through cooperative social enterprise: increasing access to healthy food, improving community health, supporting entrepreneurs and cooperatives from low-income communities; and creating opportunities for at-risk residents to earn sustainable, family-supporting wages and build wealth. Values: We believe that all communities deserve equal access to fresh, healthy food choices, but that achieving this requires moving beyond the "access" paradigm to a focus on community self-determination and food sovereignty. This means that control of the food resources and food system assets that serve the community - including land and water, food-related enterprises, and the capital and labor that go into the food system - must rest with the community members themselves, not with outside entities who claim to know what our neighborhoods need or deserve. We work to create an integrated pipeline to jobs, economic opportunity, and community wealth-building that advances racial equity. 

### LETTER FROM THE ED

Sixty years ago, James Baldwin wrote to his nephew with a deep and abiding love, preparing him for the world he would inherit. In doing so, he issued both a warning and a call to action. In 2022, we find ourselves at yet another crossroads—one where our endurance has been tested beyond measure, and where we must once again demand justice with clarity and conviction.

Angela Davis reminds us that "freedom is a constant struggle," a struggle that does not end with symbolic victories or fleeting moments of recognition but must be fought on every front —economic, political, social, and cultural. The last two years have laid bare the unrelenting forces that seek to suppress Black life, whether through police violence, systemic neglect, or economic policies that widen the chasm of inequity. COVID-19, an indiscriminate virus, found itself weaponized by systems that have long placed Black and Brown communities at the margins of care and concern. The enduring legacies of white supremacy, capitalism, and patriarchy conspire to turn moments of crisis into opportunities for extraction, erasure, and exploitation.

And yet, we resist. Our resistance is not simply about survival but about the radical reimagination of our world. A world where justice is not contingent, where we do not have to beg for dignity, where our communities are resourced—not surveilled, our children are nourished—not criminalized, our labor is valued—not stolen.

We refuse to merely endure. We demand repair. We demand the abolition of systems that thrive on our oppression and the building of structures that affirm our right to flourish. We demand a future where Black life is not a struggle but a celebration. The path to justice requires all of us—not just to envision a different world but to fight for it. As Baldwin cautioned, "Please try to remember that what they believe, as well as what they do and cause you to endure, does not testify to your inferiority but to their inhumanity." It is time to dismantle the inhumanity that has shaped this nation and build something worthy of our humanity.

The struggle continues-but so does our will to win.


