We grant equitable access to opportunities and resources.


Quality

We work to create an integrated pipeline to jobs, economic opportunity, and community wealth-building that advances racial equity. 

LETTER FROM THE ED

In a world that constantly demands our labor but withholds our care, we return to love as both a foundation and a radical act. bell hooks, a visionary of love and liberation, taught us that love is not just a personal sentiment but a political tool—one that can uproot the systems that dehumanize and exploit. In 2023, our demand is not just for policy change, but for a shift in how we imagine justice, how we cultivate community, and how we make liberation a lived experience.

bell hooks reminded us: "To love well is the task in all meaningful relationships—not just romantic bonds, but the bonds of community, the bonds of struggle." The last few years have exposed the brutality of systems that refuse to love us back. From the unrelenting violence of the state to the ongoing disinvestment in our communities, we have been forced to navigate crises without the safety nets that justice should provide.

We have been told to be resilient, to persevere, to find ways to heal on our own—but we know that healing is not an individual endeavor. It is a collective one. The future we fight for is one rooted in care. We must ask: What does it mean to build a world where Black people are not merely surviving but thriving? Where love is embedded in our policies, in our schools, in our neighborhoods? Where justice is not an afterthought, but the very fabric of our institutions?

We stand at the precipice of transformation, and we refuse to fall into the abyss of apathy. We refuse to be hardened by the cruelty of the systems that surround us. Instead, we choose to love. We choose to build. We choose to heal. This is our demand. This is our movement.

As we move forward, let us remember: Love is our birthright, justice is our demand, and liberation is our destiny.
